2018-2019 PROVINCIAL BUDGET

Montréal InVivo welcomes a budget that gives special priority to the life sciences and health technologies sector

Montréal, March 28, 2018 – Montréal InVivo is pleased with the injection of \$52.5 million into the Québec Life Sciences Strategy: "The life sciences strategy launched in May 2017 was already addressing a number of the concerns of the life sciences industry. The additional investments in some of the most popular measures of this strategy confirm the importance of our industry in the eyes of the government," said Frank Béraud, Chief Executive Officer of Montréal InVivo.

In an entire section dedicated to the life sciences industry, the Québec government is providing additional credits of \$52.5 million over five years, including:

- \$18.5 million to promote access to research data by the Régie de l'assurance maladie du Québec and by the MSSS;
- \$9 million to support the following centres of excellence: IRICoR (\$4.1 million) and MEDTEQ (\$4.9 million);
- \$15 million to bolster the funding of the Fonds d'accélération des collaborations en santé;
- \$10 million to support the Montreal Clinical Research Institute.


The budget also has several measures that will benefit the industry's SMEs, particularly reduction of the tax burden, investments in funds that support life science companies (Teralys Capital, CTS) and a \$50-million venture capital financing initiative in connection with the Québec- Ontario Life Sciences Corridor.

Montréal InVivo is also very pleased with the measure that will make the Institut de la statistique du Québec a go-to service desk for researchers wanting to simplify access to certain health data and reduce the time it takes to access this data. "It's a measure that we were anticipating and Montréal InVivo intends to monitor the implementation of this measure in response to an issue that needs to be addressed to satisfy all life sciences stakeholders and, ultimately, to benefit patients," continued Mr. Béraud.









Furthermore, Montréal InVivo wants to ensure that projects stemming from the life sciences industry will be well represented and adequately evaluated in the new \$60-million initiative for mobilizing projects, dedicated to Québec's strategic sectors.
